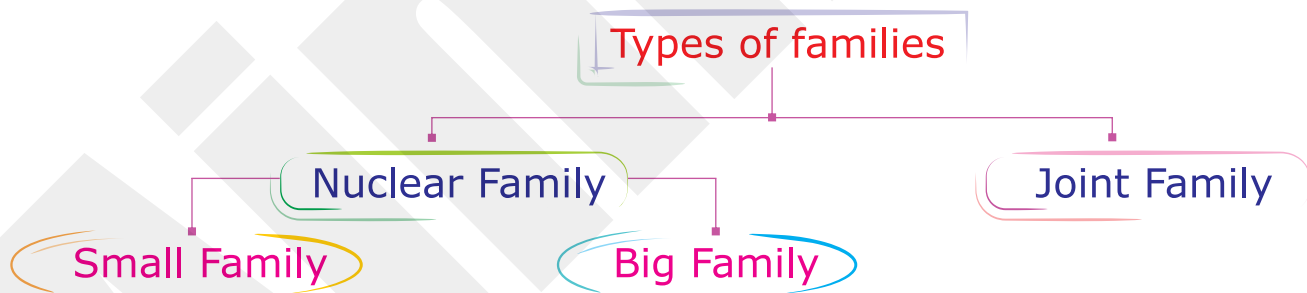

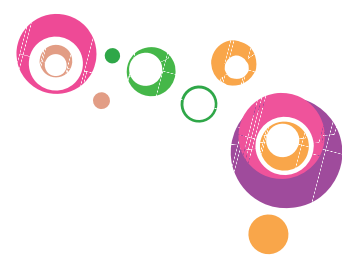
Types of Families



Nuclear Family

A nuclear family consists of parents and their children. Our brothers and sisters, who are our **siblings**, are also a part of our family.

Father, mother and one or two children make a **small** family. When there are more than four members in a nuclear family, it is called a **big** family.



Joint Family

Sisters of your mother or father are your **aunts**.

Children of your uncles and aunts are your **cousins**.

When we all live with our grandparents, parents, uncles, aunts and cousins, it is called a **joint** family.

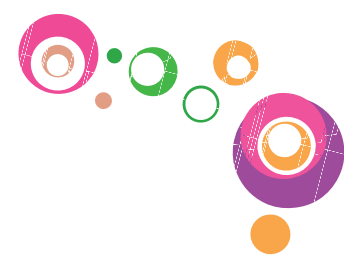

Food like sugar, rice, breads, butter and potatoes give us **energy** to work and play.

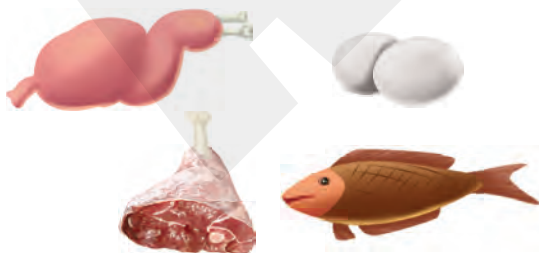
Food like pulses, meat, fish and eggs help us to **grow**.

Food which can be eaten raw.

Fruits and vegetables **protect** us from diseases.

Food can be eaten both **cooked** and **raw**. All fruits and some vegetables can be eaten raw. Pulses, rice, meat and fish are some examples of food that have to be cooked before eating.



Milk Products

Milk makes our bones and teeth strong. Food such as cottage cheese and curd are made from milk. They are good for our health.

Our food should be **clean** and **fresh**. We should keep our food covered to keep away cockroaches, flies, rats and dust. Dirty food can make us ill.

Meals of the Day

Most of the people have three meals a day. We must try to have these meals at a fixed time everyday.



Breakfast

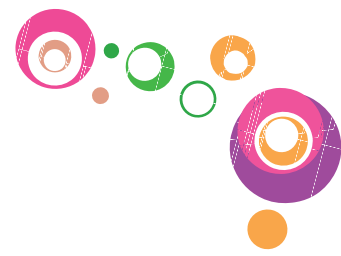
This is usually the first meal of the day. The meal taken in the morning is called **breakfast**.



Lunch

The meal taken in the afternoon is called **lunch**.





Dinner

This is usually the last meal of the day at night. The meal taken at night is called **dinner**.

Good Eating Habits

- ◆ Always wash your hands before and after each meal.
- ◆ Chew your food well.
- ◆ Avoid overeating.
- ◆ Try not to waste food.

Balanced Diet

A balanced diet has all the nutrients necessary for our body.

Vegetarians and Non-vegetarians

People who eat only plant products and consume milk are called **vegetarians**.





People who eat fish, meat and eggs in addition to the plant products and milk are called **non-vegetarians**.

- ◆ People who do not eat any food that we get from animals, even milk and milk products, are called **vegans**.

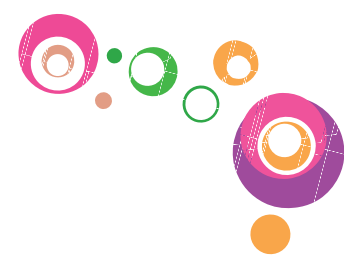

Clothes We Wear

We wear different kinds of clothes to cover our body and to protect ourselves from heat, cold, wind and dust. People wear different types of clothes depending on the season, place they live and work they do. Clothes also protect our bodies from insects. Clothes make us look smart and attractive. The early humans used to cover their body with leaves and the skin of animals.

Types of Clothes

In India, we have three main seasons :

Summer, Winter and **Rainy season**.

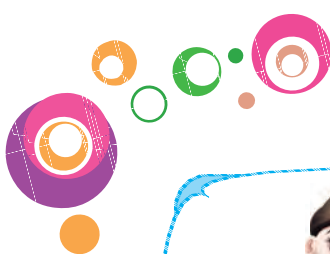
In **summer**, people wear cotton clothes that keep them cool. Cotton and linen are used to make such clothes. We get them from the cotton plants.

In **winter**, we wear woollen clothes that keep us warm such as sweaters, pullovers, mufflers, caps, socks etc. Warm clothes are also worn in places, like in mountains where it is very cold.

Clothes made up of wool are warm. We get wool from sheep, lamb, yak and even rabbit.

We also use the skin of some dead animals as leather. The leather is cleaned and made soft. It is used to make bags, purses, coats and many other things. We get leather from the skins of cows, buffaloes, goats, snakes etc.





Do you think we should kill animals for our clothes?

We should not wear clothes made of fur and leather because animals are killed to get these things.

Sometimes, we wear clothes made up from **silk**. We get silk from silkworms. Silk fibres are obtained from the cocoons.



In **rainy season**, we use clothes that protect us from rain and keep us dry. These things are generally made of waterproof materials like plastic and

rubber. Raincoats, gumboots, umbrellas etc., are used in rainy season.

People from different countries also wear different types of clothes.

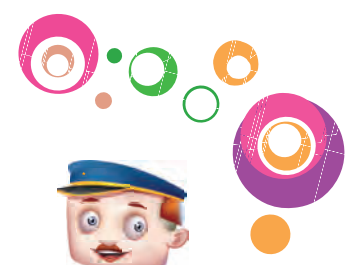

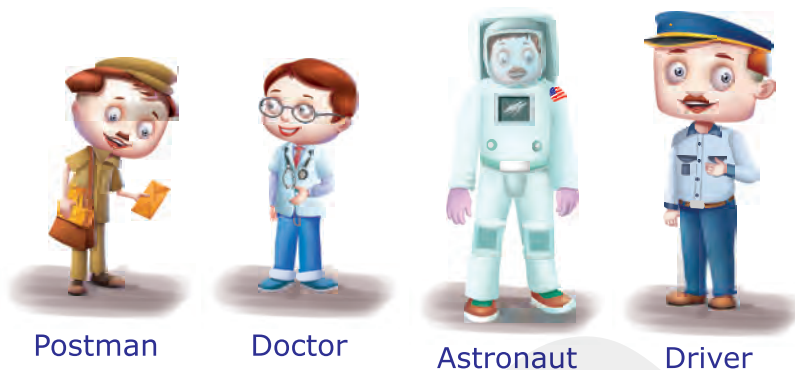

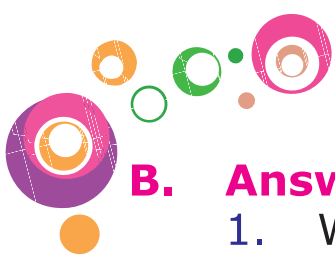

The shelter where we live with our family is called a house. It keeps us safe and protects us from all types of dangers. It keeps us warm during the winter and cool during the summer. It also gives us shelter when it rains or snows.

In ancient times, people used to live in caves. Later, they began to build houses. They used mud, stones and straw to build houses.

Different Types Of Houses



People in different places live in different types of houses.

Hut (kutchra house)

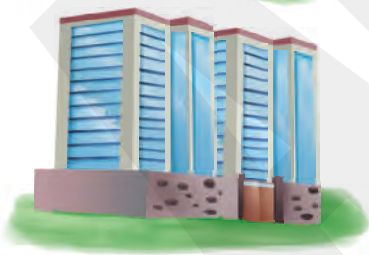
A hut is made of mud and bamboo. It has a slanting roof. The roof can be either of grass, leaves or tiles.



It is the most common type of temporary house.

Permanent (pucca) House

A permanent house is made of steel, bricks and stones.



The walls are plastered with cement.

The roof is made of concrete material and is flat.

Some permanent houses are multi-storeyed.

Do You Know?

Skyscrapers are very tall multi-storeyed buildings and are mostly found in big cities.



Temporary Houses

The houses that can be moved are called temporary houses, e.g.: tent, houseboat and caravan.

Tent

A tent is made of **canvas**. Since it is portable, it can be easily folded. It is a temporary dwelling. Now-a-days, tents are made from synthetic material. They are used by people who move from one place to another.



Houseboat

A houseboat is a floating house. These houses are generally found on lakes. Tourists visiting Kashmir and Kerala enjoy staying in houseboats.



Caravan

Some people move from place to place in search of food and water. These people are known as **nomads** (khanabadosh). These people live in houses having wheels. These houses are called caravans.



Special Houses

The houses that are made according to the environmental conditions of an area are called special houses, e.g. : igloo, stilt house and sloping roofed house.

Igloo

Some people live in polar areas. There is snow all over. So, these people make houses of snow to live in. These houses are called igloos.



Stilt House

It is made on long pieces of wood or metal. It is found in places where it rains very heavily and floods are common.





Sloping-roofed House

- It is made in hilly areas with sloping roofs so that snow and water can slide down easily.

We are blessed that we live in a decent house. Many people live in slums. Visit a slum with your teacher or parent. Interact with people living there and try to know their problems.

Water

Water is essential for all living things. It is one of our basic needs. We cannot live without water. We need water for **drinking, bathing, washing clothes, cooking food** and other purposes. Plants and animals also need water to live and grow. Some animals such as fish, crocodile, frog etc., live in water.



Sources of Water

About three-fourths of our Earth is covered with water. We get water from many sources. **Rain** is the main source of water. Clouds give water in the form of rainfall. The rainwater collects in **lakes, ponds, seas** and **oceans**. Some of it flows in form of **streams**. Some of it seeps into the ground. This is called the **underground water**.

Do You Know?

- ◆ The amount of water on the Earth is exactly the same as when it was formed. This means that amount of water that you drink today may have also been drunk by someone thousands of years ago.
- ◆ Clouds are made from millions of tiny droplets of water.



The water is filtered and purified before consuming it. This clean and purified water is collected in **overhead tanks**. From tanks, we get it through **taps**.

This underground water can be obtained by tube wells, wells and handpumps.

Some areas do not have enough water. People of these areas bring water from long distances.

Making Water Fit for Drinking

Sometimes even tap water is unfit for drinking.

- We can boil water before drinking.
- Water can be filtered using a water filter.
- Drinking water should be stored in a vessel with a lid.





Water Pollution

Sometimes, factories dump their waste into rivers and make the water dirty. This makes water unfit for drinking. Throwing garbage into water bodies can also be a cause of water pollution.



- underground : rainwater that seeps into the ground water
- essential : completely necessary, extremely important
- collect : to bring things together from different places
- filter : the liquid from which unwanted material has been removed
- purified : removal of unwanted materials from liquid

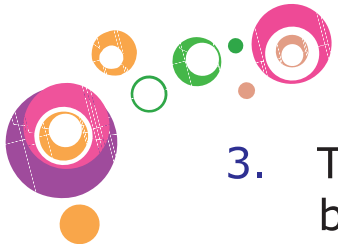

Life Skills

A good neighbourhood has various places that make it easier for the people to live a comfortable life.

Let us read about the places in our neighbourhood.

Market

There is a market in our neighbourhood. A **market** has many shops that sell different goods. Every neighbourhood needs a market place where people can get things of their daily use. Some of the shops that we can find in a neighbourhood market are:



Grocery Shop



Chemist Shop

- ◆ **A grocery shop** : We get food items and articles of our daily use here, e.g. : sugar, pulses, tea, flour etc.
- ◆ **A chemist shop** : We get medicines here.



Stationery Shop



Greengrocer Shop

- ◆ A stationery shop : We get stationery items such as pencils, pens, erasers etc. here.
- ◆ A greengrocer : We get fruits and vegetables here.
- ◆ A milk booth : We get milk and milk products, like curd, cheese etc. from here.

Police Station

Police Station

A police station is the office of the local police. The police helps to keep our neighbourhood safe from thieves and robbers. Police protects us from different types of dangers. A police officer looks after the police station and is there to help us in trouble. To call up the police, we can simply **dial 100** (a free helpline number).

Post Office

We can buy envelopes, stamps and postcards at the post office. We can also send money, parcels and letters to different places through the post office.

Do you know what happens to the letters we post?

The **postman** takes them to the **post office**. Letters are sorted out at the post office. **Postmaster** sends these letters to different places where they are distributed to their mentioned addresses by postman.



Post Office

Hospital

We go to a hospital when we are sick or injured. There are many doctors and nurses in the hospital. Doctors treat us when we are sick. They give us medicines and help us get well again. A nurse looks after us in the hospital. A good hospital also has an **ambulance** that takes us to the hospital in case of emergency. We can **dial 108** to call an ambulance.

Fire Station

A fire station has a red fire engine and firefighters. We call them fire brigade. We call up the fire brigade (by dialing 101) when there is a fire. The fire brigade comes and helps us to put out a fire.

It is our duty to keep our neighbourhood clean and green. A clean and green neighbourhood make us feel happy. Here are given some points to keep the neighbourhood clean.



Throw rubbish in bins.

Plant more trees in the neighbourhood.



We should always try not to cut trees.



We should not pluck flowers.



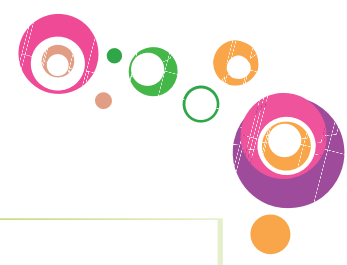

India is a **land of festivals**. Many festivals are celebrated all over the country. A festival is a day of celebrations for religious or social reasons. People enjoy the festivals together by wearing new clothes, eating delicious food and by singing and dancing.

In India, festivals may be divided into three categories :

1. National Festivals
2. Religious Festivals and
3. Harvest Festivals

National Festivals

Independence Day

Independence Day is celebrated on 15th August every year. India got freedom from the British Rule on this day in 1947. Our Prime Minister hoists **National Flag** at the Red Fort in Delhi. He also gives message to the nation.



Republic Day

Every year 26th January is celebrated as a Republic Day. On this day in 1950, our own **Constitution** was adopted. On this day, a **parade** is taken out from the Rashtrapati Bhawan to the Red Fort. The President of our country salutes the parade.



Armed forces, people from different states of India with traditional **jhankies** and school children take part in the parade.



Gandhi Jayanti

Mahatma Gandhi was born on 2nd October 1869. He sacrificed his life for the nation. Due to this reason, he is called as the “**Father of the Nation**” or ‘**Bapu**’. We celebrate his birthday on 2nd October as Gandhi Jayanti every year. The whole country pays homage at Bapu's **samadhi** located at **Rajghat**.

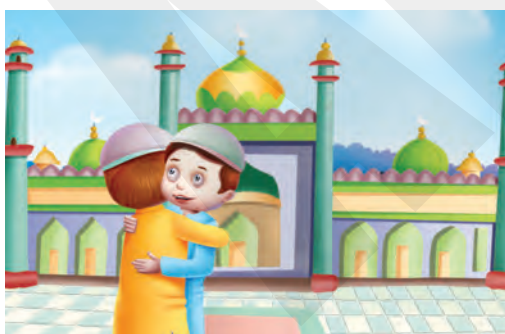

Religious Festivals

India is a multi-religious country. People of various religions celebrate different festivals.

Diwali

It is the main festival of **Hindus**. On this festival, Lord Rama had returned to Ayodhya after fourteen years of exile. People worship Lord Ganesha and Goddess Laxmi on this day. They exchange sweets and gifts with friends and relatives. They light up earthen lamps and candles in the night. They burn fireworks and crackers. It is also called the “**Festival of Lights**”.



Eid

Eid is an important festival of **Muslims**. This festival is celebrated after **Ramzan**, the Muslim month of fasting. People offer their prayers (**Namaz**) at the mosque. They greet each other by saying “**Eid Mubarak**”. **Sawaiyan** are made and offered to the guests.

Christmas

Christmas is celebrated on 25th December every year. It is celebrated to mark the birthday of **Jesus Christ**. On this occasion, people pray in the churches and sing carols. They decorate Christmas trees beautifully with lots of gifts and toys in their houses. Children wait for **Santa Claus** to bring them gifts on the eve of Christmas.

Guruparv

Guruparv is the celebration of anniversaries related to the lives of Sikh gurus. Sikhs offer prayers in gurudwaras and big **processions** are taken out. People eat from a common kitchen called **Langer**.



Harvest Festivals

Holi

Holi is a harvest festival. It is also known as the "**Festival of Colours**". People all over North India celebrate Holi during the month of March. Crops such as wheat, gram, mustard and millets are ready for harvesting. People celebrate by sprinkling colours or gulal on each other.



Onam

Onam is the most important harvest festival of Kerala. People worship king **Mahabali**.



Elephants are decorated and taken out in a procession. People enjoy a feast known as **Sadya** and join the fun at boat races.

Pongal

Pongal is the harvest festival of Tamil Nadu celebrated at the time of rice harvesting. This festival falls in January. A special dish called

Pongal Rice is made from newly harvested rice and jaggery. The cow is worshipped on this day.

All festivals, irrespective of where and by whom they are celebrated, are our own. We should celebrate them together.

Being together and enjoying the festive spirit is the essence of all festivals of India.

We also celebrate many occasions in our family. Birthday parties, marriages, family get-togethers, picnics etc., are some such occasions, we celebrate them to make ourselves happy.

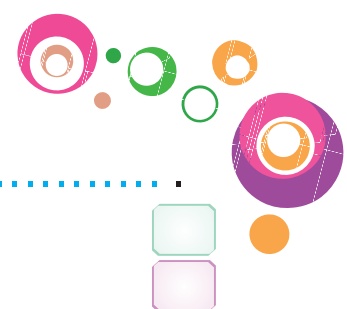

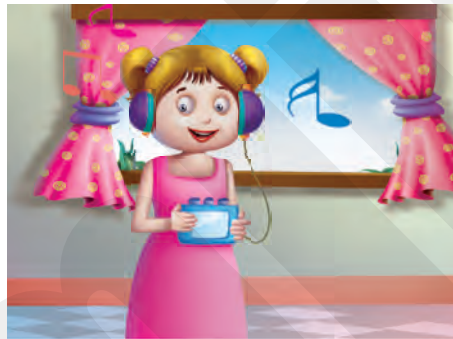

The Earth has about three parts water and one part land.

We live on the planet Earth. It is our home. The shape of the Earth is round like a ball. The Earth moves around the Sun and gets its light and heat from it. It is the only planet where **life** is possible.

Our Earth is made up of land and water. The Earth has air all around, it is called the **atmosphere**.

A small model of the Earth is called a **globe**.

We find various natural features on the surface of the Earth, such as plains, mountains, hills, rivers etc. These are called **physical features**.

Plains

Plains are flat lands. Most famous cities of India are in the plains. The plains are fertile. Crops grow well in the plains. Plains are usually hot in summer and cold in winter. Most people live in the plains.



Plain



Mountains and hills

An area of land that is higher than the land around it is called a **hill**. Hills are made of rocks. Hills usually have very fine weather all year round.



High hills are called **mountains**. The peak of mountains are always covered with snow. It is usually very cold in the mountains. The top most part of a mountain is called its **peak**. Most rivers are formed when the snow of these mountains melts. These rivers flow downwards to plains.

Valley and plateau

The low land between hills or mountains is called a **valley**. There are thick forests in the valley.

When a highland is flat at the top and looks like a table top, it forms a **plateau**. A plateau is also known as a **tableland**.



Different natural features on the Earth's surface

Seas and oceans

A **sea** is a large water body. Sea water is salty and cannot be used for drinking and cooking purposes.

Oceans are the largest water bodies. Ocean water is also salty like that of seas.

Rivers and lakes

Water is present on the Earth in many forms. Water gets circulated on the Earth as rain. Rainwater is the cleanest form of fresh water.

When snow melts on the mountains, it comes down to the plains as a river. When it falls from a great height, it forms a **waterfall**.

Rivers, ponds, lakes etc., are the water bodies found in plains.

River water is not salty and is also known as fresh water. We can use river water for drinking and for cooking, after boiling it.

Deserts

Deserts are large areas of land that are dry and usually covered with sand. There is very little water in the deserts. Only few plants like cactus grow in the desert. The camel is a useful animal in the desert as it can stay without water for many days.

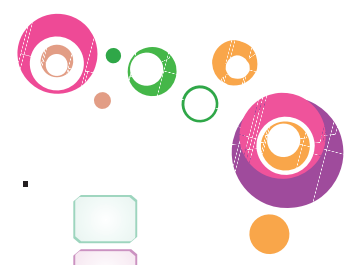

Our Earth has a layer of air around it, called **atmosphere**. Changes in the atmosphere of a place at a particular time is called **weather**. It affects our daily life. Some days are warm, some days are cold and on some other days it rains.

Weather does not remain same all the time. It keeps on changing every hour. These pictures are showing different conditions of the weather :



Hot

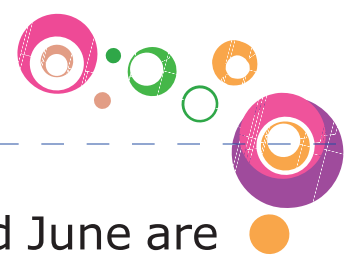

When a particular type of weather remains for a certain period of time, it is called a **season**. There are three main seasons : summer, rainy and winter. In India, we have two more short seasons, named spring and autumn.



Summer Season

Summer is the **hottest** season. In India, April, May and June are the summer months. The Sun is the hottest and brightest during these months. The days are long and the nights are short. We like to stay indoors. We like to wear loose cotton clothes. We like to use fans, coolers and air conditioners to keep ourselves cool. We enjoy having cold drinks and ice-creams. Some people go to hill stations.



Rainy Season

Rainy season comes after the hot summer season. The rainy season generally lasts from July to September. It is also called **monsoon** season. It is the **wettest** season of the year. People use umbrellas and raincoats when it rains. Ponds, lakes and rivers fill up with water. Farmers are happy when it rains. They need water for their crops.



Winter Season

- Winter is the **coldest** season. In India, it lasts from November to February. During this season, it is very cold. The Sun is not as bright as in summer. We wear woollen clothes to keep ourselves warm. We also use heaters and light fires to keep ourselves warm. We like to have hot drinks and dry fruits. The days are short and the nights are long.



Spring Season

It is the short season between winter and summer. During this period, it is neither too hot nor too cold. It is a very **pleasant** season. Flowers are in full bloom. February and March are the spring months.

Autumn Season

It is the short season between rainy season and winter. The autumn months are September and October. The trees **shed** their leaves in this season.

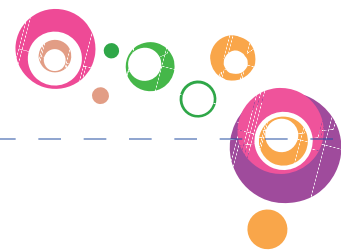

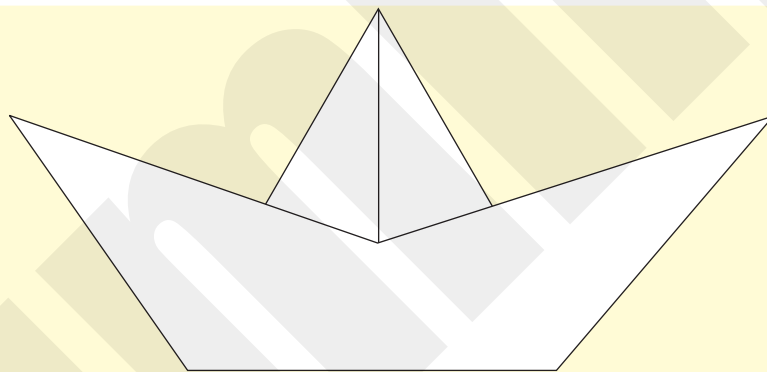

We can define the word '**direction**' as the way of movement. The words **left** and **right** tell us which way to go. They are direction words. To go anywhere, you should have the knowledge of directions. We use our hands to show the direction. The **left** hand

shows the left direction. The **right** hand shows the right direction. We need directions to find our way.

Deepak is facing the rising Sun. He is facing **East**. Behind him is **West**. The Sun sets in the West. There is **South** in his right hand and **North** in his left hand. Thus, there are four directions : East, West, North and South.

With their help, we can find four other directions.

They are called **sub-directions**.

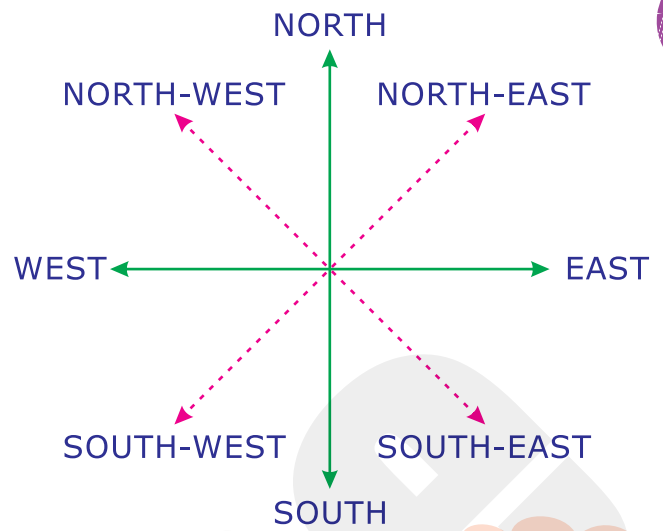

To go from one place to other place, we need directions. To locate any place, we need directions. For example, we say that Tamil Nadu is in South of India and Himachal Pradesh is in North of India.

Now, look at this map. A **map** is a drawing of an area. It helps us to find places and directions. The top of the map always points to the North direction. The lower part points to the South. To your right is the East and to your left is the West.

Before going to any place, we must know about the directions.

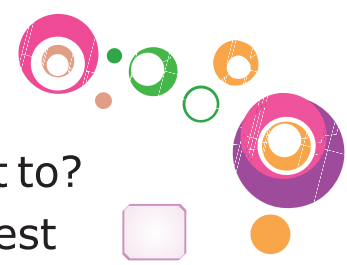

Time, Days and Months

Suppose there are no clocks, how will you know when to leave for school? How will you know when it is lunch time? How will you know when it is time to go to bed?

The Sun rises in the morning. When it rises, there is light all around. The cock crows and birds chirp when the Sun rises. We go to school. It is **morning** time.



Morning



Afternoon

When the Sun is right above our head, we call it **noon**.

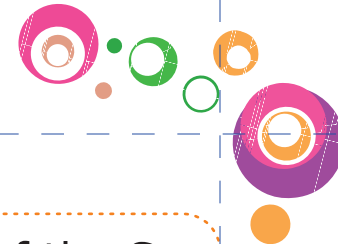
The Sun sets in the evening. Slowly, it begins to get dark. Stars and the Moon appear in the sky. It is **night**. It is now time to sleep and give rest to our bodies.



Evening

Long ago, there were no clocks or watches. During the day time, people guessed the time by the position of the Sun and the length of the shadow.

But now, we have **clocks** and **calendars** to tell us the time.



Do You Know?

- ◆ The early human guessed the time by movement of the Sun and the Moon.
- ◆ The time just before sunrise is called dawn and the time just after the sunset is called dusk.

The calendar shows us the time in a week, month and a year. There are seven days in a **week**. They are Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday. There are 365 days in a year.

There are twelve **months** in a **year**. They are January, February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November and December.

Some months (January, March, May, July, August, October and December) have 31 days. Some months (April, June, September and November) have 30 days. February is the only month that has 28 or 29 days. Every 4 years there are 29 days in February. That year is called a **Leap Year**.

We use clocks and watches to know the time of the day. There are two hands in a clock. The **short** hand is called **hour** hand and completes one round of the clock in twelve hours. The **long** hand is called **minute** hand and completes one round of the clock in one hour or sixty minutes.



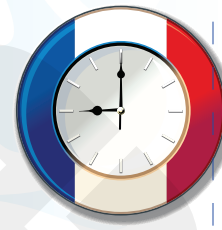

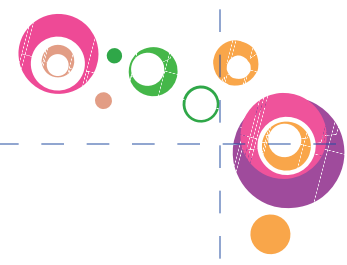

The movement of the people or goods from one place to another is called **transportation** and the different modes of this movement are called **means of transport**.

Long ago, early humans had to walk to every place, whether far or near.

Then, they learnt to ride on animals. There were no other means of transport.



Then, the **wheel** was invented.

Firstly, wheels were used in **carts** and **carriages** pulled by animals. But these were slow, and could not go far.

Slowly better means of transport came to existence. People could now travel to nearby or far away places comfortably and easily.

There are three types of means of transport.

1. Land transport
2. Air transport
3. Water transport



Different means of transport are used to go to different places.

Land Transport

In villages, people still travel by tongas, bullock carts and bicycles. In deserts, people ride on camels. It is called the "Ship of the Desert". Elephants are used in thick forests. In hills, mules and ponies are used.

In cities and towns, people travel by bicycles, rickshaws, scooters, cars, buses, trains and local trains. When we want to travel from one city to another, we mostly use trains.

Trains are comfortable and fast. They move on rails or tracks.

Trains also carry coal, machines, food, letters and other things.

Air Transport

When we want to travel long distances in a short time, we visit in an aeroplane. It is the fastest means of transport. It is an air transport.

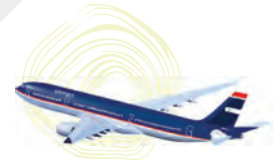


Water Transport

When we want to cross rivers or seas, we go in a boat, steamer or ship. But these are slow means of transport. A ship can take us to very far off places. It is a water transport.
